



An exhibition dedicated to the 80th jubilee of the famous Russian fashion designer Viacheslav Zaitsev was held in the Museum of fashion in Moscow in March, 2018. The exhibition included dresses, suits and accessories created by Zaitcev. Visitors were able to see one of his arguably most renowned collections, celebrating the 1000-year anniversary of the Christianization of Russia that had been first presented in New York and Paris in 1987-1988. All the models were handmade that was usual only for European fashion houses at that time. Head wear, created after Old Russian helmets, gained popularity very quickly and influenced everyday city fashion of the late 1980s. Viacheslav Zaitcev was well-known around the world. Since 1960 Zaitcev's collections had been demonstrated in the USA, Canada and Japan. A Parisian newspaper published a photo of Zaitsev flanked by Pierre Cardin and Marc Bohan, both impressed by his creations. In an article entitled "The Kings of Fashion." Cardin even described him as his equal, and the French press nicknamed him the "Red Dior."
